Building on Our Legacy

The story of the Tower began nearly two decades ago as physicians began opening their practices in close vicinity to Mercy Southwest Hospital in anticipation of expansion. Additionally, the area surrounding the Southwest campus continues to be the fastest area of growth in our community. Together, we will make the expansion a reality for our gifted physicians and their patients.

The 142,617 square feet tower will be built on the existing Southwest campus, consisting of four floors and 106 additional patient beds. The newly designed larger, private rooms will feature an efficient design, with a focus on creating a peaceful and healing environment. We are remodeling the campus to accommodate for an increase in volume and procedure types in the operating rooms, imaging, admitting, and public areas. A new entry point off Stockdale Highway and additional parking spaces are being implemented to improve easy access and visitor convenience.

The new Tower will allow the hospital to expand existing services such as the emergency department, women's health, orthopedics, oncology, intensive care and neonatal intensive care; as well as add new vital service lines, including cardiology and neurosurgery.

The official ground breaking was March 11, 2022. Since then, we have met several milestones such as completion of the new helipad. We can't wait to share successful completion of additional milestones over the next two years.











Expanded Family Birth Center & Neonatal Intensive Care

Mercy Southwest has one of the largest OB/GYN practices in Kern County. Our Family Birth Center delivers more than 230 babies monthly, with the number increasing each year. Mercy Southwest Hospital will be the only hospital in Kern County with 18 private family Neonatal Intensive Care Unit suites. These state of the art rooms afford quiet for our tiniest patients to rest and grow, as well as privacy and space for parents, grandparents and siblings to bond.

Expanded Medical/Surgical/Telemetry & Intensive Care Units

Over the past year, Mercy Southwest has exceeded 49,272 emergency visits, treating 140 patients per day. Additional beds are needed in order to provide an outlet for our emergency department, thus creating a more efficient flow into and through the emergency room. The additional rooms will all be private, designed using best practices that allow for the most efficient use of space and creation of a truly healing atmosphere.

New Cardiovascular & Neurosciences Services

The addition of medical and interventional cardiology services will be transformational to the Southwest campus and our community. The construction of two state of the art cardiac catheterization laboratories will allow physicians to intervene quickly if a patient has an emergent cardiac condition.

Mercy Southwest Hospital is a stroke receiving center, however if a patient requires intervention, they have to be transferred to Mercy Hospital Downtown. In instances like this, we know minutes matter and we will have the capability to do neurological interventions on the Mercy Southwest campus.

Expanded Orthopedic & Oncology Services

We are home to the largest orthopedic center in Kern County. More than 80 procedures are performed monthly, and this number is expected to increase. Technology enhancements, including the state of the art O-arm for advanced 3D spine mapping, will allow additional orthopedists in the region to care for their patients at our facility.

Mercy's inpatient oncology unit is the only one in Kern County and brings patients with cancer together with specialized nursing care in a single dedicated space. This enhancement allows for improved coordination of care and a better overall experience for our patients and their families. Together with our partners at Comprehensive Blood and Cancer Center (CBCC), we offer a comprehensive range of cancer treatments and therapy options close to home including GYN oncological surgery in the SA Camp Robotics Surgical Center, urogynecology robotics surgery, and other state of the art interventions.


