
FRIENDS FOR LIFE

Mercy Hospitals of Bakersfield and the Friends of Mercy Foundation are pleased to announce the fruition of a gift from Mrs. Adelaide Karpe that was given in 1979. The proceeds from the 1167 acre contiguous piece of farmland valued at over 25 million dollars will be used to construct the expansion of Dignity Health's Mercy Southwest Hospital.

Mrs. Karpe's husband, A.H. Karpe, was treated at Mercy Hospital in the Intensive Care Unit in the 1970s. At the time, Mrs. Karpe was befriended by a Sister of Mercy, Marian Joseph, who was a nurse and the Director of the Intensive Care Unit. Mrs. Karpe was touched by the Sister's compassion and commitment to Mercy Hospital's mission that she wanted to honor her in her will.

Mrs. Karpe died in 1979 and left an 1167 acre contiguous piece of farmland to Mercy Hospital. The land was first purchased by the Karpe family in 1940 for \$10. When she passed, the land was valued at \$1,000,000. Recently, the ranch was valued at over \$25 million. Mrs. Karpe had the foresight to restrict the gift to be sold and used only to build hospital facilities.

Now, 42 years later, the Friends of Mercy Foundation has sold the land with the proceeds to be used for the construction of the Patient Care Tower at Mercy Hospital Southwest. For the first time, cardiac and neurosurgery will be available to Kern County residents west of Highway 99, and additional intensive care unit, neonatal and patient care rooms, filling a critical need in the community. Mrs. Karpe's gift of generosity will literally change the landscape of healthcare in our community.

The Tower Expansion Project at Mercy Hospital Southwest will include:

- 106 Private Patient Rooms
- A New 24 Room Intensive Care Unit
- 18 Private Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Rooms
- State-of-the-Art Cardiac Catheterization Suites
- Expanded Neurosurgery Capabilities
- 6 additional Operating Rooms
- Specialized Oncology and Orthopedic Units
- Expanded Emergency Department
- Additional Parking and Campus Redesign



Adopt A Unit

Last winter, Mercy Hospitals began to see a surge in COVID patients that lasted well into the New Year. In addition to the significant increase in patients (the most patients Mercy Hospital has ever had admitted during its 111 year history), those that were with us were extremely sick, many couldn't have visitors and during the holidays our caregivers stepped in as surrogate families.

Having battled with the pandemic for nearly ten months, the fatigue was setting in. Wanting to boost their spirits, we asked our trusted donors and Board Members to adopt units or prepare baskets to thank the staff in a personal way. The response was unbelievable! 39 individuals and businesses, many joining as a group or families, delivered over 60 baskets and meals to all areas of the hospital. The creativity and thoughtfulness was evident – and stood as a wonderful testament of your appreciation to Mercy Hospitals.
