In February 2020, the William Howell Century Club, now in its 10th year, used their cumulative gift of \$102,000 to fund equipment for five departments at Mercy Hospitals. Friends of Mercy Foundation Wins Quality Improvement Award



We are very proud to share the Friends of Mercy Foundation was recognized with the Quality Improvement Phillies Award at the 2020 CommonSpirit Health Philanthropy Education Summit Reimagined. The annual Phillies Awards are a system-wide celebration recognizing the efforts and accomplishments CommonSpirit Health's affiliated fundraising entities achieved in the prior fiscal year.

The Quality Improvement Award celebrates the CommonSpirit Health affiliated fundraising



fundraising expenses decreased by 5% and cost per dollar raised decreased by nearly 45%. Overall, transfers to Mercy Downtown and Mercy Southwest increased by over 10% and transfer multiple by nearly 20%.

Robotic Center of Excellence

In February 2020, Mercy Hospitals of Bakersfield's S.A. Camp Companies Robotic Surgical Center received the Center of Excellence in Robotic Surgery from the Surgical Review Corporation. This designation recognizes hospitals and surgeons who demonstrate unparalleled commitment and ability to consistently deliver safe, effective, evidenced based care. Mercy Hospital is the only hospital between the bay area and Los Angeles to have achieved this distinction.

Even though the program has been open for less than 2 years, it is now the largest in the area, completing more than 500 cases with 13 surgeons, specializing in gynecology, oncology-gynecology, uro-gynecology, urology, bariatrics, general surgery. In addition to the daVinci Xi, we also have added a Mako robot to support our orthopedic surgeons.

None of this would have been possible without the support of our generous community. On behalf of the patients who had better outcomes, less complications and faster recovery, delivered right here at home, we thank you.
