The Catherine McAuley Society met on March 23, 2011 at Stockdale Country Club to vote on what to fund with their combined gift of \$115,000. This society started with 54 members five years ago and today Since establishing the society, members have raised has 119 members. \$434,000 for various projects at Mercy Hospitals.



There were 3 proposals presented for funding and members chose to fund technology & equipment for the family birth center; specifically a Medfu-

sion Syringe Pump Upgrade, 12 NeoPuffs, a HeartStart NICU Defibrillator, a Panda Infant Warmer and a SimBaby (used for educational training). These pieces of equipment can all be used immediately and will improve quality and allow the staff in the Birth Center to provide perfect care to our youngest patients.

The Healing Garden - Unique to Kern County

The only hospital healing garden in Kern County is now complete at the Mercy Truxtun Campus. The garden was funded from a substanial gift from Diane Lake. She wanted to build a healing garden to honor her daughter, Catherine Lake, who had been treated and cared for during her fight with cancer at the Florence Wheeler Cancer Center. Mrs. Lake has been a generous benefactor of Mercy Hospitals over the past several years, including charter membership in the Catherine McAuley Society.

The garden location was chosen because of its accessibility to patients and their families, staff, physicians, volunteers, and the public. It will serve as a passageway from the parking lot to the hospital entrance for anyone who wishes to walk through it. It is intended to be a quiet and reflective place.


